Ways to Prove Your Identity and Citizenship

A federal law requires each U.S. citizen eligible for Medicaid to provide proof of citizenship and identity. The state already has information for some people. If you are required to provide documents to prove citizenship and identity, the lists below will help you decide the best way to do this.

▶ **Provide any one of these three documents, which establish both identity and citizenship:**

- ◆ A U.S. passport
- ◆ A certificate of naturalization
- ◆ A certificate of U.S. citizenship

Or...

▶ **If you don't have one of the documents listed above, you can provide one document from each of the lists below.**

To verify citizenship:

- ◆ U.S. birth certificate
- ◆ U.S. Citizen I.D. card
- ◆ Hospital record of birth
- ◆ Northern Mariana I.D. card
- ◆ American Indian card with classification code KIC
- ◆ Religious record of birth with date and place of birth, such as baptism record
- ◆ Affidavit from two adults establishing the date and place of birth in the United States

To verify identity:

- ◆ Current driver's license with photo
- ◆ DPS I.D. card with photo
- ◆ Work or school I.D. card with photo
